The newsagent in Magnus Street, now carries a line Carole Driver of Montmartre art supplies, which they have taken over from the liquidators.

A good selection of acrylics is carried, and these include premium acrylic brand Satin acrylic. Montmartre premium brands are really quite good, obviously not Windsor and Newton quality but not bad at all and very useful for beginners, sketchbooks and journals.

The hardbound sketchbooks are also good quality and very solid and strong and you can throw a bit of water at them okay as well, also brushes are excellent if you choose well.

I think it's really good that we have these reasonably priced art supplies easily available to us. I love these materials for working out ideas and experiments - gives me freedom to not worry about using my pro materials - but still get a good result.


Featured Artist Diana Atkinson

Diana moved to Port Stephens in 2016 and is a member of the Port Stephens Art and Craft Society. Diana is inspired by the works of Australian Masters such as Tom Roberts,
